## GOLF HOLIDAYS 2007-2008



### BOULDERS GOLF CLUB NORTH AND SOUTH COURSES CAREFREE, ARIZONA

The Boulders Club is nestled in the tranquil beauty of the high Sonoran desert and 12-million year old granite boulder formations that dot the landscape. From the ancient Indians to the modern day golfers who come play in the peace of a spectacular natural setting, all have been drawn to the vast serenity of the terrain and the precariously balanced boulders silhouetted against the Sonoran sky. The natural terrain has been left in place on both sides of the fairways, so the course has that true desert feel.

The 6811 yard par 72 North course is the older of the two and features bent grass with spectacular views of Black Mountain as the course meanders through the Boulders community. Both courses are built right into the desert foothills and offer breathtaking panoramas - including stunning boulder formations, striking Sonoran Desert sunsets and natural desert terrain. Keep your eyes open because desert wildlife is often visible during play. Every day, golfers are surprised to see a bobcat, rabbits, coyotes or a javelina while hunting for a wayward shot. In short your experience should be a scenic and natural wonder.

The 6726 yard par 71 South course provides its players with much of the same experience they would find on the North course. The scenic views and desert beauty continue - with even more locations for the perfect photographic moment. Many people believe that the South course is the most scenic. In fact it has holes that go right up into the boulder formations. During your round you will encounter the signature "Boulder Pile" and also "Rosie's Rock", two of the resort's most recognizable rock formations.

Both courses feature the famous Coyote rule. That is to say, if your golf ball is seen to be nicked by a Coyote, mistaking it for a fresh egg, you may play the next shot with a replacement without penalty. Nice!

The Boulders Golf courses have received an enormous array of awards and distinctions, Golf Magazine gave it its Gold Medal in 2006 and The Boulders is one of only 5 resorts to win the Gold Medal in every Golf Magazine ranking since it began in 1988. The same publication rated the 5th hole as one of the best in the world, and in 2006 Conde Nast readers Poll ranked it in the Top 50 Golf resorts in America.



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
